2022 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE ST. MARTIN BOXING CLUB

The St. Martin club has long understood that to bring about posture results with youth, the best results are through the use of mediums. St. Martin boxing is such a medium, especially among inner city youth.

We've started our 54th year of year around service to Rochester youth made possible entirely by volunteers and financial contributions from community supporters.

We hold four free practices a week with several coaches trained, tested, and certified by U.S.A. Boxing, an affiliate of the USOC. Officials are similarly trained. Practices and local shows are made possible through the cooperation with the Montgomery Center and Southwest Neighborhood Association. In many cases, transportation is provided to youth for practices.

We are very happy to play a major role in the impressional age group of youth 8 through 16 years by conducting the N.Y. State and Region 1 Silver Gloves (40th year this year) in this age group. We held the New York State Tournament December 3 & 4. We are running the Region 1 Tournament January 7 & 8 in Watertown. We also are in charge of the Region 1 Silver Glove team at the Nationals in February. The Regionals pits state champions from New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, and the rest of New England and winners qualify to compete in the National Silver Gloves. We were elected to the National Silver Gloves Hall of Fame in 2008. Additionally, we had three USA sanctioned shows at Montgomery - 4/30 (the date of our first show back in 1970), 6/18, and 10/1 with area and state competitors. Older and veteran boxers often serve in helping to teach boxing skills and proper behaviors through example.

This year members of the St. Martin team competed 22 days here and in Albany(including Region 1 Silver Gloves), Buffalo(including Upstate Golden Gloves), Independence, Missouri (National Silver Gloves), Ithaca, Lockport, Syracuse, and Tulsa, Oklahoma(National Golden Gloves, where St. Martin's Kieshawan Stone placed second). He's trained by his father, a former St. Martin boxing standout.

In June the St. Martin Boxing Club was recognized and honored by the Monroe County Legislature as an organization "to honor and celebrate...to make Monroe County a better place to live..."

This year we are trying to work more closely with the courts. There has been interest. Of course we welcome referrals from all agencies and individuals.

A major concern is obtaining a new van to replace our aged van which is a boxing lifeline for many St. Martin boxers for practices and traveling to shows. We are especially interested in ways ro realize this vital goal.

St. Martin Boxing is a medium used to encourage positive values and activity among its members including positive behaviors, education, training, and employment. Please note a list of a few of our "graduates" working and contributing in our community,
