Here's what we will have accomplished since June 22:

-We have provided training four nights a week and transportation for many youth AT NO COST FOR TRAINING OR TRANSPORTATION since 6/22- We supplied boxers for the USA Boxing required Test Show held in Buffalo 7/17. We traveled to Syracuse for a show 10/2 at the Syracuse Athletic & ducation! Center.

- We ran the postponed 2021 New York State Silver Gloves July 24 & 25 at Montgomery Neighborhood Center. We ran the Region 1 Championships in Rochester on Lyell Avenue. We then transported two to Independence Missouri, for the National Silver Gloves.
- On 9/25 we traveled to an all star show in Bristol, Pennsylvania.

We ran the 2022 New York State Silver Gloves November 27 at Montgomery. We've slate the Regionals at Utica January 8 & 9. The Nationals are the first week in February in Independence, Missouri.

-We ran a large show at Montgomery October 23 featuring local clubs versus out of town clubs, including an outstanding team from Cleveland. This bout was sponsored by the KIWANIS CLUB OF ROCHESTER. This is at least the third show sponsored by Kiawanis. Earlier ones were Adam Street Recreation Center and Marshall High School. Give lots of credit to the leadership of Joe Simeone.
