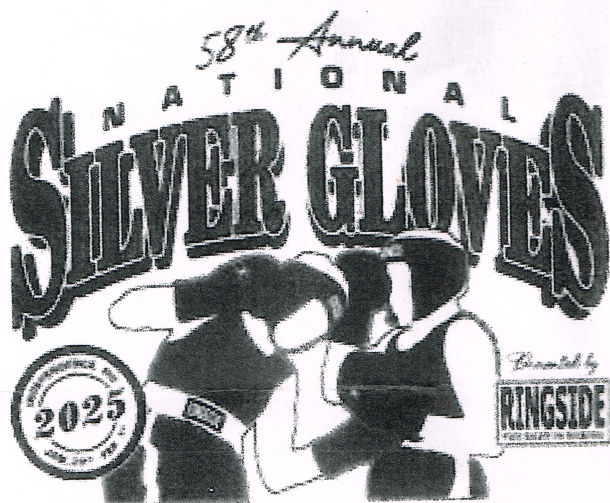

56th year of continuous service to Rochester youth

1/24: BUFFALO GOLDEN GLOVES: BUFFALO RIVERWORKS: St. Martin had three entries scheduled, but only one made it to the ring. Superheavyweight Charles Hayes fought Buffalo Bombsquad's Jamal Laguerre, an opponent he'd lost he had lost a close decision at the Bombsquad Buffalo show 1/14. This time the decision was again close, but Charles got the decision. Jabs and some occasional right hand leads against the southpaw swayed the majority of the judges as he took a 3-2 decision. The next round of the Gloves is February 22. Two entries didn't get on the show. St. Martin's top entry - 165 Paris Davis was medically nixed. He'd suffered injuries in an auto accident 12/14 and returned to training. However, on 1/23 his Strong Hospital doctor still put off his return to competition. Maybe there might be a cancellation enabling entry in the Gloves. St. Martin's other entry, John Rondon, bowed out due work and family issues. Since his mother's death he has had to assume many family obligations.

1/28-2-1: NATIONAL SILVER GLOVES: Stoney Creek Hotel & Conference Center, Independence, Missouri. Survivors of the four States and the Regional traveled to seek National honors. About 50 made the trip representing our Region 1. A few were successful. Upstate had a number of contenders who did well, but couldn't take the Silver. Lockport's Solomon Britton won a National Title. St. Martin's 101 Amazynn Dees-Bullock was eligible, but her lack of experience caused her to stay home for local bouts to get the necessary experience. Regional runnerup 65 Brendon Davis had a chance to replace the winner from Connecticut, but it wasn't known in time to go. Overall, Rochester boxers did well and were competitive. In a strange event, several Rochester boxers and adults came down flu in coming home....



2/15: SYRACUSE ATHLETIC & EDUCATION CENTER: Action returned to this long standing place for area competition. Three St. Martin boxers were requested. However, Paris Davis failed to get his work time switched and stayed home to work. 65 Brenden Davis was matched with Upstate's Gaven McDermott, an opponent he'd previously lost a decision. This time he scored a 3-0 decision and he generally seemed in command throughout. 60 James Hollister hoped to get his first bout ever, but the age/weight factor didn't work out and he got no action. Nice clear roads going, but snow made getting away from Syracuse a bit treacherous.
