
56th year of continuous service to Rochester youth

12/14: BUFFALO BOMBSQUAD: Two St. Martin boxers got on a 17 bout card before a nice crowd. They both opposed Bombsquad opposition. 65Brenden Davis scored a 3-0 decision over a tough Josef Dshloui. Brendon used good boxing skills and he appeared to take all three rounds. 201+Charles lost a decision to Jamal Lagurre in a good effort. Charles seemed to win the first round, the second was close, and Dshloui took the third. Charles continues to show improvement. Driving was great on a clear dry on the Thruway.

Winners competed for the right to win national championships in Independence Missouri January 29 - February 1. Several Rochester area youth advanced. St. Martin's 65Brendon Davis, however, lost a narrow decision in the finals to Connecticut's Iman Abedini.
